IFKA Public Benefit Non-profit Ltd as the partner of the SI Plus – Social Innovation Competence Centres partnership organizes the 1st online meeting of the thematic network on poverty and inclusion.

The SI Plus project aims at establishing national social innovation competence centres in order to make them able to support Managing Authorities in planning and implementing subsidy programs for boosting social innovation. The project also helps social innovators in order to benefit the most from those programs. Finally, the partnership supports other competence centres via networking and knowledge exchange activities to help them being more effective in their social innovation development activities.

The "Poverty and Inclusion" thematic network is one of the three thematic networks of the project. It serves the assessment of the burning problems and policy trends in the field of poverty and inclusion on the one hand, and supports the exchange of experiences and social innovation good practices for tackling poverty and enhancing inclusion in the partner countries on the other.

In line with these general objectives, the 1st meeting of the thematic network will focus on the presentation of the main challenges of poverty and inclusion on the European level and the leading EU policy trends including social innovation to mitigate them.

After the presentation of the European frameworks by the expert of the European Commission DG Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion, a national-level example of operationalizing the EU policy strategies will be discussed. Experts of IFKA will give a short introduction into the poverty- and inclusion-related priorities of the Human Resources Development Operational Programme Plus (HRDOP Plus) and the representative of the Ministry of Interior will present the dedicated social innovation priority of the Hungarian ESF+ programme, namely the "Emerging Settlements Programme" that is also a good example of scaling social innovation.

After the policy-focused programme parts, the emphasis will be put on the practice. Participants of the meeting will get an insight into member state-level good examples of social innovation initiatives targeting the mitigation of poverty and inclusion-related issues. The best practices to be presented will include a programme for providing social services to sexual workers in Austria, a nurse-family partnership program from Bulgaria and inclusive approaches for housing and supported employment from Slovakia.

Participants will have an opportunity to address questions to the speakers and to discuss further cooperation opportunities in the future.
